

Bed Management Indicator Descriptions

Note: The indicators below can be stratified by region, sub-region, facility/site, service/bed type, and date updated daily.

Indicator Name	Description	Refresh Frequency
Occupancy Rate	Numerator: The number of patients admitted (includes patients admitted into conventional and unconventional spaces).	Daily
	Denominator: The number of operational beds available for occupancy.	
	Calculation: (numerator divided by the denominator), multiplied by 100.	
	Note:	
	Operational beds refers to beds in conventional spaces that are available for occupancy, and includes physical/budged, incremental/pandemic and unbudgeted staffed beds, but excludes closed/blocked beds.	
Number of Empty Beds	Number of operational beds available for occupancy, subtract the number of patients occupying a bed.	Daily
ICU Occupancy Rate	Numerator: Number of patients admitted to ICU (includes patients admitted into conventional and unconventional spaces).	Daily

	Denominator: Number of ICU beds, subtract closed/blocked beds. Calculation: (numerator divided by the denominator), multiplied by 100.	
Surgical and Combined Medical/Surgical Occupancy Rate	Numerator: Number of surgical and combined medical/surgical patients admitted (includes patients admitted into conventional and unconventional spaces). Denominator: Number of surgical and combined medical/surgical beds subtract closed/blocked beds. Calculation: (numerator divided by the denominator), multiplied by 100.	Daily
Surgical, Medical, and Combined Medical/Surgical Occupancy Rate	Numerator: Number of surgical, medical, and combined medical/surgical patients admitted (includes patients admitted into conventional and unconventional spaces). Denominator: Number of surgical, medical, and combined medical/surgical beds, subtract closed/blocked beds. Calculation: (numerator divided by the denominator), multiplied by 100.	Daily
Throughput	Number of patients admitted, subtract discharges and deaths.	Daily
